Edwards' Civilian Military Support Group Spring Mixer Enjoyed By All

The Edwards AFB Civ-Mil Support Group Spring Mixer was well attended and greatly enjoyed by all. It was held at BeX Grill on Lancaster Boulevard the evening of May 19. Over 110 attended, and reaction was that this "was the best Spring Mixer ever."



The Air Force Flight Test Center Commander, Brig. General Robert C. Nolan II headed the many command staff attendees from the base. Col. Gregory E. Schwab, Commander, 95th Air Base Wing and Col. Dawn M. Dunlop, Commander 412th Test Wing were there. Lt. Col. Ronald E. Cleaves, Commander of the Air Force plant 42 also was there. Both of Edwards Command Chiefs, CMSgt. Bill Thomaston and CMSgt. Chris McCollor were in attendance.

Most of the Civ-Mil groups Directors were there as well as many of the 125 members, many accompanied by their partners. Palmdale was represented by Councilman Mike Dispenza, and Kern County by Bryan Williams, local representative of Supervisor Zack Scrivner. Among the civic leaders was George C. Nagy, President/CEO of Mojave Desert Bank.

Brig. General Nolan thanked the Civ-Mil Support Group and the community for its "incredible community support" throughout the 60 year history of Edwards Air Force Base. "We sincerely respect the help and support we get from the community," said Nolan, "It really does make a huge difference."

The base now has about 13,000 personnel, and there is mutual support between the base and the surrounding communities.

Nolan said the base was now home to six of the new JSF aircraft, and would soon have nine of these newest Air Force aircraft. Those are larger numbers than originally planned, assigned here because of the outstanding work being accomplished in the test program.

He said in recent weeks, 30 new airmen have arrived, 8 of whom had young children. They have taken advantage of the Airman's Attic, which Civ-Mil is in the process of supplying with attractive carpeting

Another military officer in attendance was Air Force Reserve Brig. General James R. Hogue, who is the mobilization assistant to General Nolan. Among his other duties, General Hogue directs base support for space shuttle landings at Edward, upon requests from NASA Dryden Flight Research Center.

The evening was enhanced by continuously restocked heavy hors d'oeuvres tables. Many complimentary gift awards and gift baskets were handed out by drawing. There was a 50/50 drawing to benefit the Airman's Attic project. Director John Fergione arranged the mixer. Director Bob Slade and wife Michelle admirably handled the door and the raffle tickets.

The Edwards AFB Support Group exists to support warriors who support warriors. "I joined Civ-Mil because, as a veteran, I wanted to be able to take part in helping our young military men and women make their quality of life a little bit better," said Director John Fergione. "As a member, I feel I am achieving that goal, one project at a time."

About 125 civic leaders raise funds and contribute to provide essential but Air Force-unfunded activities such as "goodie bags" for deployed troops; Christmas family dinners and gifts for low-level enlisted; and a dorm Internet Café. The current project is about half accomplished. It is providing carpeting for the Airman's Attic, which helps the enlisted Airmen and their families. The Attic has clothes, household appliances, furniture and toys, etc. all free of charge.

New membership rolls close on May 31st this year. However, those who join before will get a free four months of membership as they will be enrolled until Oct 1, 2012. In addition to knowing you are supporting our troops; members-only obtain networking contacts with both business and military leaders. There are also social gatherings and unique member's only opportunities to participate in Air Force events. Also, Edwards AFB is considering granting base access passes to Civ-Mil members.

Chapter 5: The Honorary Commanders' Program

When Curt and Ina Bedke arrived at Edwards AFB in October, 2004 they knew there had been an Honorary Commanders' program in the past, but it had apparently not been maintained. They had some email notes referring to Joan Witte, from Paramount, as the Test Operations Honorary Commander, but they don't remember if any other squadrons still had one. He wanted to formalize the program across the Air Force Flight Test Center (AFFTC), and so he talked with Aida O'Connor, naturally, and they got things rolling.

In an email sent by Mike Belzil, who is currently the EAFB Civ-Mil President and was then the AFFTC/DS (Director of Staff) on Wednesday, July 27, 2005 (Can you believe Ina still had the original email? – Oh yes, if you know her, you can!), Mike wrote that Maj Gen Bedke planned to formally announce the establishment of the Edwards Honorary Commanders Program during his remarks at the Civ-Mil Annual Barbecue at Lane Ranch on the following evening. From a handout prepared by the AFFTC:

The Edwards AFB Honorary Commanders Program will pair Center, Wing, Group and selected Squadron Commanders with community leaders for a 1-year "tour". These pairings will encourage community-military leadership interaction and promote mutual involvement in base and community events. The program offers a great opportunity for community leaders to gain insight into EAFB operations. Military leaders will benefit through greater involvement in key community events. In-

creased interaction between civilian and military leaders will foster mutual cooperation, trust and esprit de corps.

Honorary Commanders invite Comanders for a night at Jet Hawks ball park.



Host Commanders will invite their respective honorary commanders and spouses to unit events such as tours, quarterly awards presentations, commander's calls, holiday parties, barbecues, ceremonies, deployments, and homecomings. In return, honorary commanders will include military leaders in similar community events. At the conclusion of the 1-year tour, host commanders will be paired with different honorary counterparts to promote expanded interaction with community leaders.


