
Thank you Terry Scott!

Members of the Air Force Materiel Community Leadership Program met at Colorado Springs, Colo., Nov 6 - 7 to learn about the Air Force mission at the area bases. They visited Peterson and Schriever Air Force Bases, as well as the Air Force Academy.

Air Force Materiel Command's Community Leadership Program is designed to give community members from cities surrounding AFMC bases the opportunity to learn more about the Air Force's mission at other bases. They also meet with community leaders from those facilities around the country.

While at Peterson AFB, the community leaders from Edwards Air Force Base, Bret Banks, Alis Clausen, Rex Moen and Les Uhazy, received a briefing from AFMC Commander, Gen. Bruce Carlson about the current state of the Air Force and AFMC since their last meeting in May.

Their trip started with a briefing about Space Command and a tour of its facilities.

They also received a briefing from the Air Force Academy Commander, Lt Gen John Regni about the mission of the academy. While at the academy the group watched soldiers parachute, visited the parachute loading facility and had lunch with the cadets.

At Schriever AFB they received a briefing and toured the satellite monitoring facility. Schriever is part of Air Force Space Command and is responsible for keeping tabs on numerous military satellites.
