

President's Remarks

Four programs the management at Edwards AFB administers to aid the younger members of the Edwards community are:

Child Car Seats: Used to provide portable infant car seats to financially struggling first-time parents,

Emergency Relief Fund: Used for emergency situations, such as airfare for a death in the family, car repairs, rent, food, utilities and other related expenses,

Exceptional Family Member Support: Used for the purchase of gasoline cards for traveling to medical centers outside of the local area,

Holiday Meal Program: Used to provide holiday gift baskets for families.

In 2013, thanks to donations we received, the Edwards AFB Civ-Mil Support Group was able to donate \$8,500.00 to these programs. This amount was increased to \$10,000.00 in October, 2014.

This year, the Flight Test Historical Foundation (FTHF) honored the 70th anniversary of the U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School at their annual Gathering of Eagles event, and hosted a reception at the "School-House". Since acting as a host group for dignitaries visiting Edwards AFB is clearly part of our charter, we donated a little under \$500.00 to help the FTHF with their expenses for hosting this event.

All of the above happened before I was even officially inducted as the fifteenth person to hold the title of President of the Edwards AFB Civ-Mil Support Group, though my term officially began on October 1. The Officers and Class of 2017 Directors were installed on the evening of October 23 at the University of Antelope Valley by California State Senator Steven Knight and Brig. Gen. Michael Brewer. It was a delightful evening, and I would like to

think everyone who attended the event thoroughly enjoyed themselves. My sincerest thanks to Danny Bazzell, Michael Belzil, George and Diane Nagy, Aida O'Connor, Michele Slade and Julie Swayze for their efforts in making this event such a class act.

Our 25th Anniversary historical book is shaping up nicely. To date, all of the historical data have been reviewed and cataloged. The arduous task of layout and editing remains, but the work there is steadily being accomplished. My sincerest thanks to Diane Nagy, Aida O'Connor, and Richard Spann for the many hours they have spent in what I am sure will be an exceptional book.

As a result of the extensive historical review that was conducted, we were able to fully organize and catalog our historical data. Richard Spann then found us a climate-controlled, and secure, storage facility so that we could store all of this data in one location, and that is where it now resides. Thanks Dick!

Stan Turner has taken on the chairmanship of the committee which will maintain our Web site, <http://www.eafb-civmil.org>, and has been working with our webmaster to add the capability where our membership database will be securely held and maintained on-line. This will result in a huge reduction in workload for our Membership chairman, George Nagy, as the members will be able to view and update their personal information on the Civ-Mil Web site. When this capability is introduced, I'll certainly let you know.

Plans are being finalized to clean "our" carpet in the Airmen's Attic at Edwards Air Force Base. As you remember, we donated the carpet to this facility a few years ago and it has received some significant use since then. With a reasonable bid on-hand to clean the carpet, the decision was made to have this accomplished. At the request of the folks who supervise the activities at the Airmen's Attic, the cleaning is being scheduled to take place in January, 2015.

It was reported to us recently that the Flags at our Flag Park were in need of replacement. The flags are being

Civ-Mil celebrates new officers and 25 years of service

It was a night filled with giving thanks to all the members of the Edwards Air Force Base Civilian-Military Support Group, past and present, for all the hard work, dedication and time spent throughout the years working to support the base at Edwards, Calif.

The Group, whose mission is to establish a friendly working relationship between local civilians and military leaders from Edwards, held its 25th Installation Dinner of new officers and directors at the University of Antelope Valley Oct 23.

On this special night guests were greeted at the door by Civ-Mil Group Member, Chris Spicher, owner of the An-

telope Valley Florist who presented each female guest with a long-stemmed rose.

This being a milestone year for the organization, the event was filled with lots of reminiscing, praise and awards for members of the Board.

Special praise was given to Aida O'Connor, founder and very first president of the Board for all her years of service. O'Connor served as president twice, the first time in 1989, the year she started the organization, and again in 2007. Today O'Conner serves as an Honorary Lifetime Director.



Awards were presented by outgoing president Danny Bazzell and the first award of the evening was presented to outgoing directors Roger Hemme, Patricia Russell and Cathy Hart and was a token of appreciation for their service.

Dennis Anderson, editor of the Antelope Valley Press was the evening's keynote speaker. He applauded America's military.

Anderson said the [United States] Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines and Coast Guard are a partnership.

"The role of our services is to oppose evil and to affirm that which is good," he told those attending the event.

The second award of the evening, the Unsung Hero Award, is dedicated to the member who gave above and beyond the call of duty, "The person who served behind the scenes and out of the lime light, but always there," Bazzell explained. For the first time ever the Unsung Hero Award was presented to two individuals, Terry Landsiedel and Pan Patel. Each was given a plaque that read, "In recognition of excellence, continuous commitment and distinguished service."

The Member of the Year award went to past secretary Julie Swayze, who, Bazzell said performed her service tirelessly and without question. Swayze received a total of five commendations from state and local leaders.

Brig. Gen Michael Brewer, commander of the Edwards AFB 412 Test Wing was on hand for the Installation of Directors and State Senator Steve Knight presided over the Installation of Officers.

Knight paid tribute to outgoing president Danny Bazzell and said Civ-Mil is only as good as its leader and said Bazzell did a great job.

Al Hoffman, president of the Antelope Valley Board of

Trade said there is a lot of common interest between the Board of Trade and Civ-Mil and thanked Bazzell for his service as President of the Board for Civ-Mil.

Bazzell played down the praise directed at him and thanked the organization for the honor of being able to serve as its president.

“I’ve never been president of an organization before, so stepping into these shoes wasn’t easy,” he said.

Bazzell said it’s all about team work and thanked Civ-Mil members for their guidance.

Incoming president John Fergione joined the organization in 1998. “I joined because I was told all we do is have fun,” Fergione told Aerotech News.



Fergione admits now he didn’t realize how much work fun could be.

A retired Naval Captain and aviator, Fergione, who has made somewhere near 300 landings on a Navy carrier has a unique concept of fun, but says working with the Civ-Mil Group is definitely fun.

“I have already talked to Colonel Radomski, the vice commander of the 412 Test Wing and asked him to give us some ideas for this year’s service project,” he said.

The organization is currently supporting four programs on base. Child Car Seats is one of the Civ-Mil-supported programs, it provides portable infant car seats to financially struggling first-time parents.

Emergency Relief Fund is another and is used for emergency situations such as airfare for emergency travel, car repairs, rent, food, utilities and other related expenses.

Another is Exceptional Family Member Support. This program is used by the Airman or his or her spouse who might have to travel to a medical facility located off base and the cost of gasoline might be a hardship. This support is used to buy gas cards.

The Civ-Mil Group also supports a Holiday Meal Program that is used to provide holiday gift baskets for families.

In addition to these programs the group also supports the Airmen’s Attic and the Higher Grounds Internet Café and hosts groups visiting the base.

The Board has already approved spending \$10,000 this year on its projects and Fergione said members and Edwards AFB management personnel will submit ideas on

how to spend additional money. He said the Board will evaluate each idea and decide which programs and ideas to support.

Bazzell wished Fergione the best on continuing on with the Civ-Mil mission, “It’s very challenging, but rewarding,” he told the new president.



“We have a lot on our plate, but we have an exceptional Board of Directors and there’s no doubt in my mind they will work as hard for me as they did for Danny, Fergione said and thanked Bazzell for his service.

Incoming directors are John Fergione, Cam Martin, Al Hoffman, Lisa Moulton, Julie Swayze, Terry Landsiedel and Richard Spann. The directors will serve in their newly appointed position through 2017.

Incoming officers are: John Fergione, president; Mark Thompson, vice president; Matt Winheim, Secretary; Dr. George “Bud” Reams, treasurer, Danny Bazzell, past president and Mike Belzil, director at large.

The evening was emceed by James Charlton who said it was a privilege to attend an event that was so well attended. More than 100 people attended the Civilian Military Support Group’s 25th Installation Dinner.

Civ-Mil is delighted to welcome Colonel David "Radome" Radomski and congratulate him on recently undertaking duties as Vice Commander, 412th Test Wing, Edwards Air Force Base. Col Radomski has already immersed himself in all things Civ-Mil! Shortly after his arrival, he attended an introductory meeting and dinner with the Civ-Mil Executive Committee, and he has established himself as a regular attendee at monthly Civ-Mil board meetings. Col Radomski's primary responsibility at the base is as Gen Brewer's principal deputy in leading the 7,100 personnel comprising the 412th Test Wing. Like many of his colleague aviators in the flight test community, Colonel Radomski is no stranger to Edwards AFB.

A distinguished graduate of the Reserve Officer Training Corps at the Georgia Institute of Technology, Col Radomski's previous assignment to Edwards was in 2000 as a student at the USAF Test Pilot School. Upon graduation in 2001 as an Experimental Flight Test Navigator, he remained at Edwards as an F-15 Flight Test Weapon Systems Operator in the 416th Flight Test Squadron and, later, as a Flight Commander in Test operations until 2003. Col Radomski returned to Edwards in July 2014, in his current position, following assignments, in order, at: Eglin, the Pentagon, Eglin (again), Spain, and, most recently, Texas. He is a Master Navigator with over 2,400 hours of flight time, including 151 combat hours, in 45 different aircraft types, including the F-15, F-16 and F-111.

Johnstone, 78, flight test engineer, planner

Robert “Bob” Johnstone, a driving force behind developing math and science educational programs and opportunities in the Antelope Valley and among those responsible for local engineering degree programs, died Saturday. He was 78.

The Lancaster resident was a former civilian flight test engineer and long-range planner for Edwards Air Force Base, and lived in the Valley for 51 years.

“Bob Johnstone had a real passion for education. He worked tirelessly,” said Les Uhazy, dean of math, science and engineering at Antelope Valley College, who worked with Johnstone on numerous science and technical education initiatives.

“He was quite the guy. We’re going to miss him. He was the lynchpin and he was so willing to accept that responsibility,” Uhazy said.

Johnstone’s passion for education was not so evident in his early years. Bored with high school, the New Jersey native left after his sophomore year, going to work at a grocery store and later at his uncle’s printing plant.

He later enlisted in the Air Force, where he earned a high school equivalency degree, and took an early discharge in order to attend college. In 1961, he was the first engineering graduate from Centenary College in Shreveport, Louisiana, while making the Dean’s Honor Roll.

Johnstone also has graduate degrees from Golden Gate University and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces.

Johnstone began work at Edwards as a civilian flight test engineer in 1963, moving on to the planning office after 18 years.

Following his retirement from Edwards, Johnstone started The Aerospace Office with fellow Air Force retirees Phil Brady and Bill Lawrence in 1996 in an effort to promote Edwards as a launch site for the X-33 and other future space programs.

Supported by the city of Lancaster, the office provided technical expertise on a range of aerospace-related issues.

One topic they addressed was the difficulty in attracting engineers to the Valley to support the industry here.

Uhazy remembers when Johnstone and Brady approached him about developing engineers locally instead of trying to recruit from elsewhere.

Thus was born the Math, Science, Engineering and Technology Consortium, bringing together those in industry and education to increase and improve the availability of math, science and engineering education in the Valley.

The organization was promoting what is now popularly known as STEM--for science, technology, engineering and math--before it was recognized as such, Uhazy said.

Among the many developments to come from that effort that will be part of Johnstone’s legacy are the Project Lead the Way pre-engineering programs at nearly a dozen area high schools and college engineering programs with California State University Bakersfield and Fresno.

Johnstone was instrumental in bringing the college programs to the Valley, Uhazy said.

He also helped lead the effort to establish a four-year, technical-oriented university in the area.

“Bob was so significant in that,” Uhazy said. “He’s going to be missed.”

In addition to the MSET Consortium, Johnstone was involved with the Antelope Valley Career Prep Council and the East Kern Educational Resource Network.

Johnstone was awarded the 2007 Professional Achievement Award by the Antelope Valley College Foundation for his education efforts.

In the early 2000s, Johnstone lent his expertise to the Edwards Community Alliance, providing direction on how to best protect Edwards from possible closure during rounds of Base Realignment and Closure, or BRAC.

“He’s indispensable,” said Tom Wardlaw, president of the Edwards Community Alliance, in 2004. “The scope of knowledge he has is unbelievable.”

Johnstone is survived by his wife, Barbara, and daughters Shelley Hawkins, Melinda Tomlinson and Rhonda Marriott-Gonzales, as well as seven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
